Regulation changes 2009:

- The Dunlop KT10 wet is replaced with the KT11. Only the KT11 will be allowed in KF1 and KZ1, but both permitted in KZ2 and 210 all year. Tyres will be open in 250 National, 5" or 6" permitted, but only 1 set of slicks per meeting.
- Diagonal sidepod bars permitted for older TKM karts, crash tested bodywork is compulsory though.
- Disc protector compulsory if the disc is level or below the chassis (gearbox excepted - other than KZ1).

- Minimum age for Junior TKM and MiniMax reverts to 11th birthday.
- The BS6658 Type A has only one more year of use, and the Type A/FR has been put on notice of withdrawal as well.
- Rear wheels cannot be inside the pods when wets are fitted in 2009, except in the TKM classes.
- 40mm min washers required where seat stays are attached to the seat.
- Teams with awnings should have a min of a 2kg foam/powder fire extinguisher..
